

Goals of the HSRU Alliance


- Double the number of Hispanic doctoral students at our universities
- Increase Hispanic professoriate at our universities by 20%

Contributions of the HSRU Alliance (2022-23)

- 216,308 total degrees awarded, 30.1% Hispanic students
- 35.4% of undergraduates receive Pell grants
- 13,676 doctoral degrees awarded
- 13.5% Hispanic faculty
- \$7.9 billion total annual research expenditures







Figure 5: HSRU Alliance Actual and Projected Faculty Goal Progress¹⁵





Hispanic-Serving Research Institution Ecosystem





Ecosystems operates at different level:

- Interconnectivity of practitioners and structures




Validation and Interconnectivity


Equity Definition (in Progress)
